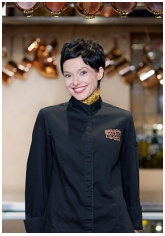

## 21 JAN Global restaurant list includes 14 from SA

La Liste, a new selection of the 1 000 "most remarkable" restaurants across the globe, was recently published, with 14 South African restaurants to make in onto the list. Ranked on the list were 12 in the Western Cape and two in Gauteng.

The 14 South African restaurants, with their rankings, that made the list are:

La Colombe (228); Tasting Room (362); Greenhouse (368); 500 at The Saxon (372); Restaurant Mosaic (373); The Restaurant at Waterkloof (409); The Test Kitchen (425); The Pot Luck Club (447); Terroir (494); Jordan Restaurant (516); Massimo's (749); 96 Winery Rd (762); La Boheme (782) and The Roundhouse (816).

To determine the winners, La Liste used score averaging and semantic from over 200 food guides, review sites, gourmet blogs, social media, and major national and local publications in 48 countries.

La Liste says it uses an "algorithm that quantifies the weighted average of reviews from critics, publications and diners" to arrive at the final result.

Measurements also includes references on websites such as Trip Advisor.

Overall, Japan comes top with more than 126 mentions, France is second on 118 and America third on 101. Britain has 46, while restaurants from 45 countries also get mentions.

The top five rated establishments worldwide on La Liste, in order from the top, are: Restaurant de l'Hôtel de Ville (Crissier, Switzerland), Per Se (New York, USA), Kyo Aji (Tokyo, Japan), Guy Savoy (Paris, France) and Schauenstein (Fürstenu, Switzerland).
