Newly released Inverroche Limestone Aged 10 Year Rum is unique due to the lime-rich waters of the Still Bay region of the Southern Cape. The rum is exceptionally smooth, mature and balanced, offering up a palate of butterscotch, complex wood and spice notes, as well as orange zest, walnuts and ripe plums. 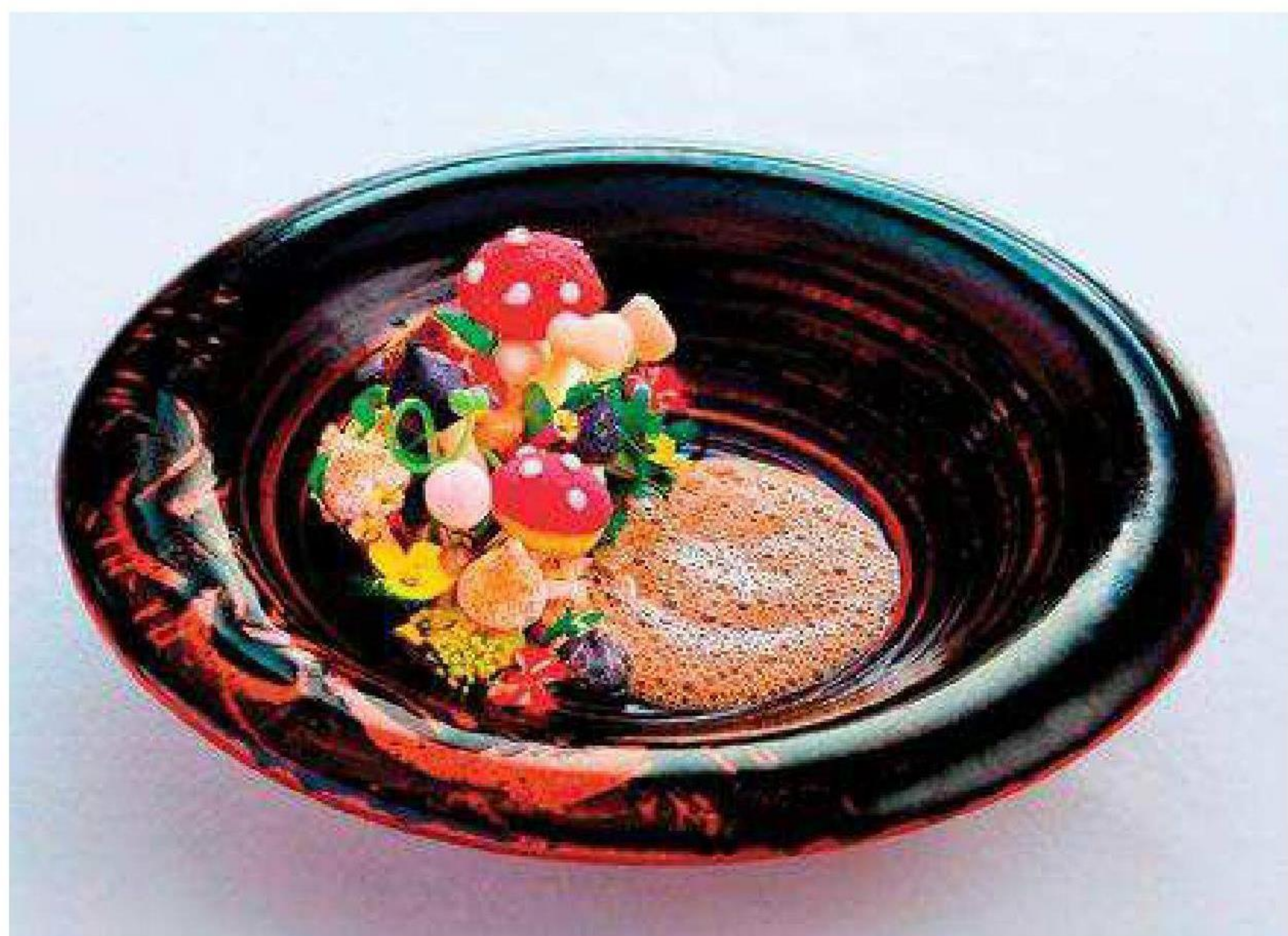
